

# **DRESS CODE**


Appropriate clothing and attire are required to take part in the Conference.



# LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT OF ICJ

Dear participants of GeMUN 2023,

My name is Giorgia Zilioli, and I am delighted to welcome you all to the 20th edition of our Genoa Model United Nations conference as President of the International Court of Justice.

It is a great honour for me to be here writing this letter. A couple of years ago I would never have imagined that my GeMUN experience would come to such a conclusion. Everything almost started as a game: when the former President of ICJ asked me to participate, I considered it as an interesting activity to break the quarantine's monotony I was drowning into. So I simply sat in front of my computer without any particular expectation, well dressed but with my favourite pyjama trousers on. Originally, I thought to myself I would not have the courage to take the floor, but this assumption turned out to be false just about 20 minutes into the debate. In fact, my first MUN saw a little and frightened judge transforming into a hyperactive creature who asked about a trillion questions. At the end I was exhausted, but I had never been more enthusiastic. After that began my journey from judge to advocate, and finally to President of the Court.

When I think about my GeMUN experience, I suppose I can consider myself quite lucky: after joining the ICJ I never thought of changing committee. However, though it might seem strange, taking part in GeMUN was not a life-changing event itself. It was indeed important, but the real turning point was and still is - finding great colleagues. During the past three years I had the chance to meet extraordinary people: clever, interested, dedicated, bright, ingenious, sharp-witted, hard-working, always ready to improve, hungry for knowledge; they have made all the difference. There was - and still is - something spectacular and inspirational about seeing such passion and dedication in an environment whose stereotype is to be cold and apathetic. Every time I enter the Court, my fellow colleagues remind me of every single lesson ICJ taught me. Because, after all, it was not the Court of Justice but rather its members who made me understand the unique value my opinion holds; the importance of building said opinion weighing every factor and piece of information; the subtle art of looking at the big picture; the non-existence of an all-black or all-white truth; the benefit of constructive dialogue and cooperation. I could go on for lines.

Most people assume in the ICJ there is a specific hierarchy, but I deem it a lie. Even as a President, I am not the teacher nor the mentor: they are mine. It is part of the beauty of the ICJ, everyone can learn from each other priceless lessons, because no one is there to teach but to learn. No title or position will ever substitute the members of the Court I met during these years, which is the reason why I feel incredibly honoured to finish this inestimable journey as President.

It is my pleasure to introduce the case that we will be trying this year: "Application of the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination". It concerns a dispute between Azerbaijan and Armenia over the conflictual situation in the Nagorno-Karabakh area. More specifically, the Court will discuss and deliberate on whether the actions carried out by the Respondent have resulted in a violation of its obligations under international law. I wish you all a memorable GeMUN experience and I look forward to welcoming you into our courtroom in February.



On the map, the subway system is marked with the letter "M". There is also a stop in "Piazza De Ferrari", where Palazzo Ducale is located. The subway system connects Piazza De Ferrari with the two biggest railway stations in the city: Genoa Piazza Principe and Genoa Brignole. There are also some of the most beloved tourist attractions, for instance Via Garibaldi or Christopher Colombus' house. While tourists mainly come to see these attractions, there are many that are not marked on the map.
